Permission has been granted by the Canadian Kennel Club for holding these events under the Rules and Regulations of the CKC, Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club. No entries will be accepted, altered, cancelled or substituted after the official closing date and time for entries, except for as provided in the rules. These events are held under the rules of the "Canadian Kennel Club".

Limited entry 90 dogs (wait list of 10 dogs will be taken)

Entries open: Wednesday May 15th, 2024 @12 pm

Entries close: Wednesday May 29th, 2024 6 p.m. (or when limit is filled)

To be held outdoors rain or shine at: Red Barn Event Centre, 8464 CR 27, Barrie, ON

Mixed & unrecognized breeds permitted (with CKC CCN)

"Veteran Dogs" means dogs that are seven (7) years or older on date of event. On the entry form you must identify a dog being entered as a veteran.

Females in season must wear a clean, dry, snugly fitting panties specifically designed for the purpose of preventing/containing discharge."

We cannot accept day of event entries. Entries can only be submitted online at <u>https://redbarneventcentre.com/trials_workshops.html</u> and you must enter all 3 runs with the same dog. No emailed or paper entries will be accepted

Entries will only be accepted with full payment. Payments must be paid within 48 hours of entry. Send payment by E-transfer to sprinterspd@gmail.com

Refunds

There are NO CREDITS nor refunds for anyone wishing to pull their entries after the closing date. The only exception to this is an injured dog which requires a veterinarian note confirming this. In case of public health restrictions that prevent the event from occurring a full credit will be provided to your account to be used within one year. No refunds will be issued.

As of January 1, 2020, as per CKC regulations if a dog is injured after entry has been submitted to the Trial Secretary, a veterinarian's certificate, certifying the dog was injured before a 3-day period preceding the trial, must reach the Trial Secretary on or before the start of the trial. The club will refund the entry minus the TCN fee and a 30% administration fee.

If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to start or to complete this event, no refund of entry will be made.

Camping:

Entry fee per dog per event: Before closing	\$70.00 for all 3 runs, includes HST
Exhibition Only (dogs not entered but on the event grounds)	\$13.30 includes HST
TCN fee per dog per run	\$11.30 includes HST (this fee is charged by the CKC)
Please note: each entry fee includes the CKC Recording Fee of \$4.70 + H	ST. All fees are payable in Canadian Funds.

Payment: No invoices will be sent; you must pay trial fees immediately after entering.

Confirmations will be sent once payment is confirmed<mark>, please do not send emails to secretary to confirm, send them to registration@redbarneventcentre.com</mark>

Send electronic transfer to: sprinter June 17, in comments, if you are cued to give a password please use the word sprinter.

No credit cards will be accepted. If you submit payment to the wrong email address, there will be an additional \$10 processing fee as it is significant work for us to track down the payment and transfer it. Once payment is received you will receive a confirmation from the Red Barn. If you don't get a confirmation within 72 hours of payment email registration@redbarneventcentre.com

Please do not email secretary to confirm receipt until the 72-hour time period is over.

Unpaid entries will be deleted without notice.

Cheques will not be accepted due to the short turnaround time of this trial.

Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made. Females in season or lame dogs will be excused and their entry fees refunded provided notice is given prior to or during roll call

HEALTH REMINDERS:

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;

2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);

3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

Trial Procedure:

New dogs and/or handlers MUST identify themselves when they register and are required to come to the event one hour early so that they may get a full briefing and start running prior to other teams arriving. If you missed registering as a new team, please contact the secretary immediately so that we can provide you the extra support you need.

1. When you arrive, park and proceed to our CHECK IN TEAM where your dog will get his/her first lameness check. All bitches must be swabbed and if she is in season, they must wear well fitted pants the whole time they are outside of their car at the event. This is a CKC rule.

2. Participants who have experienced dogs are then asked to initiate their first run. This is done by the catcher taking their recording sheet to the finish line and handing it in to the gate steward. Dogs will be called by their event number, so please ensure it is on your recording sheet and you know your dog's number.

3. When catcher has went to the finish line, the releaser can proceed to the start line with the dog. The start line gate steward and start line wrangler will be calling out dog numbers to keep the line orderly. We will not hunt for dogs, so please ensure that you can be found.

4. Once a dog completes their first run, the finish line wrangler will return the recording sheet to the catcher and the catcher and dog should proceed for 2nd lameness check and a qualifying ribbon if the dog got a time. After 3 runs, if you've earned a new title rosette, you can purchase it from the lameness checker, please write out your dog's name, your name and title so we can include it in the new title sheet.

5. You will determine when you want to run your dog a 2nd and 3rd time. You must complete all the runs with your dog before our published lunch break (if you are in morning heat) or finish time (if you are in afternoon heat). To start your next run please follow steps 2 to 4 as written above.

6. If you want to finish and leave quickly, this new method will allow you to do so. If you have multiple dogs, you can either rotate each dogs turn or complete all turns for one dog, then start the next dog. You must plan your time according to your team's specific needs. We will make an announcement when there is LAST call for runs 15 minutes prior to shutting off the lure machine. If any dogs haven't finished their morning runs, teams will be required to wait one hour until our volunteers have rested and had their lunch.

7. All competitors are responsible for looking at the online live results sheet to ensure their dog's information is correct prior to the trial as well as after the trial.

Important SPRINTER rules:

The releaser must be capable of safely holding and releasing the dog. If someone has a disability, they can be the releaser but that must be disclosed so we can put a volunteer with that releaser to ensure the safety of the person and dog. We can only accommodate a couple of people for this at each trial and it must be disclosed in the entry form. If the wrangler, start line gate person or starter determines that the releaser or dog or other dogs are in danger due to the person's ability to release or dog's state of arousal during the trial the STARTER may either request a trained trial volunteer to release the dog or dismiss the dog from the trial without refund.

<u>You can NOT leave a dog barking in your car the whole time</u>. Do not let your dogs react to other dogs and the lure equipment when it is not his/her turn. This prevents others from fully enjoying the trial experience and our neighbours do not appreciate it.

All competitors **MUST** bring 2 leashes, one for the releaser and one for the catcher. There will be no extra leashes or handlers available. The dog owner is responsible for ensuring that their second person is present at the event on time. We cannot wait for any missing humans.

You cannot release or catch a dog with shoes showing any exposed skin. Shoes must cover the entire foot or you will **NOT** be able to run your dog. There will be NO refunds for this.

When a dog runs on the sprinter track, he/she must wear a flat collar with no tags. No harnesses, slip leads or martingale collars can be left on a dog when they run.

You must let the trial secretary know in advanced if your dog may be hard to catch so the volunteers can get the catching pen ready. Please do not try to go in the pen with your dog. Wait for the volunteers to safely catch your dog and they will inform you when it is now safe to get your dog.

Washrooms are accessible from the EAST side of the Red Barn. We cannot provide any access to drinking water at this trial.

You are responsible for bringing a pen, record sheet that was emailed to you. There will be no extra copies onsite. You are responsible to convert your time and points (info is on your record sheet) or download the rules from the CKC website at https://www.ckc.ca/en/Files/Forms/Shows-Trials/Event-Rules-Regulations/Sprinter-Rules-and-Regulations-Effective-January-1

The event secretary will not be available to competitors at this trial. All information will be sent to the CKC as required and the CKC will notify you of your titles earned. Final results will be LIVE on the Red Barn website.

Absolutely no one can sell any services or products at our trials. This includes photography, wellness services, treats, toys and other items. Please respect our club's choice to keep our atmosphere fun and casual.

In order to make everyone's visit a safe and enjoyable one, please respect Red Barn rules:

- 1) PLEASE drive slowly down the long driveway. 10 km limit!
- 2) There is a private residence at the front of the property. Do not walk your dogs down the driveway towards the residence as it upsets the dogs who live there.
- 3) Only park in the designated parking area.
- 4) Dogs must be on leash (no flexi leashes are allowed) at all times, except when competing in the ring. No
 exceptions.
- 5) Not all dogs love other dogs. Please keep your dog under control and out of other dogs' faces, even if your dog is friendly.

- 6) Please pick up your dog's waste. Disposal bags and sites are readily available. Red garbage cans are doggy waste only.
- 7) Please clean up after yourself. Please take home your garbage and recycling (other than doggy waste-red garbage bins).
- 8) No smoking anywhere on the trial site.
- 9) Please do your best to keep barking to a minimum
- 10) Be nice to our volunteers. Remember if you want to be treated with respect give others the same respect.
- 11) If there is anything, we can do to make your trial experience better, please let us know.
- 12) Sprinter is a team sport, so please leave prong or electronic collars and other correction gear at home.

VOLUNTEERS:

They are essential to help run these events, so we can all enjoy our dogs having fun.

Please consider volunteering at these events, learn to work as a starter, timer, begin learning about lure operating or helping other exhibitors with releasing or catching. You must let us know ahead of time. Thank every volunteer!

Directions to The Red Barn Event Centre: 8464 County Road 27, Barrie, ON L4N 9C4 Please do not use address in GPS, use these GPS coordinates: lat 44.344860 long - 79.741025 From the 400: Take the Essa Road exit. Turn west on Essa (sign says Essa Road South). Turn right at Ardagh Road. Follow Ardagh to County Road 27. Go South on County Road 27. (aka Town Line Road) Property is on the west side of the road down a long driveway. There is a private residence at the front of the property. From Hwy 27: When traveling North on CR 27 you must turn left shortly after passing through the town of Thornton. Look for the 20th Sideroad on your left and then the 10th Line on your right, that's your cue to slow down. Then

you will see a small sign on your right that shows you must turn left to stay on CR 27. Turn left on CR 27 and continue north. After passing Mapleview Dr. W. you will go down a big hill, the Red Barn is on your left at the bottom of the hill.

EARNING POINTS: The dog's time to complete the 100-meter dash is converted into KPHs (the CKC conversion chart is used). A handicap system is applied based on the height of the dog at its withers (as per CKC) Handicap: Under 12" = 2.0,

12"- 18" =1.5, Over 18 = 1.25 Points KPH multiplied by the dog's handicap. KPH = 360\dog's time

Sprinter Titles will be awarded for dogs that accumulate the required points. For purebred dogs, these are suffix titles that will appear on a dog's pedigree with a higher-level title superseding a lower level title.

Novice Sprinter (NS) = 150 points Sprinter (S) = 500 points Advanced Sprinter (AS) = 1,000 points Sprinter Excellent (SX) = 1,500 points SX followed by a number (e.g. SX@) for every additional 500points

Veteran Novice Sprinter (VNS) =75 points Veteran Sprinter (VS) =250 points Veteran Advanced Sprinter (VAS) = 500 points Veteran Sprinter Excellent (VSX) = 750 points Veteran SX followed by a number for every additional 250 points

** It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit, on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A non-member participation fee of \$62.40 plus HST will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

These events are open to mixed and unrecognized breeds. In order to compete, mixed and unrecognized breed dogs must have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) from the Canadian Kennel Club and must have a CKC-approved microchip. Mixed-breed dogs must be spayed or neutered. Unrecognized-breed dogs do not need to be spayed or neutered. A dog eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a listed dog. If a dog is not registered individually in the CKC studbook it may be entered as a listed dog per CKC rules for this designation, as of July 1, 2018; exhibitors must apply to the CKC for "temporary competition number (TCN), before event closing date". Effective January 1, 1992, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). This ERN does not register a dog for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act, but rather enables a foreign-owned dog to be awarded titles by the Canadian Kennel Club. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN, mail or fax a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with a cheque. Cost is \$62.40, plus taxes. Event rulebooks and application forms for the CCN, ERN and Non-Member Participation Fee are available on the CKC website. For more information, contact: information@ckc.ca

Foreign Exhibitors: Personal US cheques will be accepted in US funds, but due to fluctuating currency rates they cannot be discounted. Please do not mark personal foreign cheques "Payable" in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as they will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Thank you.
